Sri Lanka State Trading (General) Corporation Limited, which is a fully Government owned self-financed Corporation operated under the Ministry of Trade, Commerce Food Security and co-operative Development, has been authorized by the Cabinet of Ministers to import up to twenty thousand eight hundred metric tons (20,800 MT) of Medium Grain Parboiled Nadu Rice depending on the market requirement. The Chairman, Standing Cabinet Appointed Procurement Committee (SCAPC) on behalf of the Secretary Ministry of Trade, Commerce Food Security and co-operative Development invites sealed bids from eligible and qualified bidders for the procurement of Medium Grain Parboiled Nadu Rice.

1. Interested eligible bidders may inspect and download the bidding document from the website <https://stc.lk/rice2024> commencing from **12th December 2024 until 19th December 2024**.
2. Bidding will be conducted through International Competitive Bidding Procedure.

3. Bidding will be conducted under the International Competitive Bidding process as follows:

4. Qualification requirements of bidders include;
 - A. Minimum annual average turnover of USD 9 million or equivalent within the last three years. (i.e. 2021/22, 2022/23 and 2023/24)
 - B. Minimum 5 years of experience in exporting rice
 - C. The bidder must have successfully completed a minimum of four export orders, with each order at least 5,000 MT of rice within the last 3 years up to 31st November, 2024
 - D. The Certificate of Origin issued by the Trade and Development Authority or a relevant authorized institute of the country of origin should certify that the items quoted are genuinely of the specified country's origin.
5. Properly sealed bidding documents along with required certificates in duplicate may be sent through the courier / registered post or hand delivered by bidder or their authorized agent along with samples of 4 kg in 4 Nos 1kg packets of quoted variety with the cover marked top left-hand corner of the envelope **“Supply of Medium Grain Parboiled Nadu Rice - STC/SCAPC/2024/002” on or before 19th December 2024 11.30 a.m.** and sent to the Chairman, Standing Cabinet Appointed Procurement Committee (SCAPC) 1st Floor, Main Lobby, Sri Lanka State Trading (General) Corporation limited, No. 100, Nawam Mawatha, Colombo 02. Colombo. Late Bids shall not be accepted.

6. Bids will be closed soon after above mentioned time (**19th December 2024 11.30 a.m. Colombo**) and opened immediately in the presence of the Bidders' authorized representatives who chose to attend.
7. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security that is irrevocable, unconditionally encashable, and equal to **USD 100,000, valid until 08th February 2025.**

The bid bond to be issued either

- a. From commercial bank operating in Sri Lanka approved by the Central Bank of Sri Lanka
- or
- b. From commercial a bank based in the country concern backed by commercial bank operating in Sri Lanka and approved by the Central Bank of Sri Lanka

Section I. Instructions to Bidders (ITB)

ITB shall be read in conjunction with Section II. Bidding Data Sheet which shall take precedence over ITB.

General

- 1. Scope of Bid** 1.1 The Purchaser indicated in the Bidding documents, issues these Bid Documents for the supply of Goods and Related Services incidental thereto as specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements. The name and identification number of this procurement are specified in the Bid document. The name, identification, and number of lots (individual contracts), if any, are provided in the Bid.
- Throughout these Bidding Documents:
- a) The term “in writing” means communicated in written form by mail (other than electronic mail) or hand delivered with proof of receipt;
 - b) If the context so requires, “singular” means “plural” and vice versa; and
 - c) “day” means calendar day
- 2. Source of Funds** 2.1 Payments under this contract will be financed by the Sri Lanka State Trading (General) Corporation Limited unless otherwise stated in the document.
- 3. Ethics, fraud and corruption** 3.1 The attention of the Bidders is drawn to the following guidelines of the Procurement Guidelines published by National Procurement Agency;
- Parties associated with Procurement Actions, namely, suppliers contractors and officials shall ensure that they maintain strict confidentiality throughout the process;
 - Officials shall refrain from receiving any personal gain from any procurement Action. No. gifts or inducement shall be accepted; Suppliers / contractors are liable to be disqualified from the bidding process if found offering any gift or inducement which may have an effect of influencing a decision or impairing the objectivity of an official
- 3.2 The Purchaser requires the bidders, suppliers, contractors and consultants to observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and executive of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy.
- a) “corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;
 - b) “fraudulent practice” means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;
 - c) “collusive practice” means a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Purchaser to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels; and
 - d) “Coercive practice” means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract.

If the Purchaser found any unethical practices as stipulated under ITB Clause 3.2, the Purchaser will reject a bid, if it is found that a Bidder directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question.

4. **Eligible Bidders**
- 4.1 All bidders shall possess legal rights to supply the Goods under this Contract.
- 4.2 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All bidders found to have conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they:
- a) are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Purchaser to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under these Bidding Documents, or
 - b) Submit more than one bid in this bidding process. However, this does not limit the participation of subcontractors in more than one bid.
- 4.3 A Bidder that is under a declaration of ineligibility by the National Procurement Agency (NPA), at the date of submission of bids or at the date of contract award, shall be disqualified.
- 4.4 Foreign Bidder may submit a bid only if so stated in the BDS.
5. **Eligible Goods And Services**
- 5.1 All goods supplied under this contract shall be complied with related applicable standards stipulated by the Sri Lanka Standards Institute (SLSI) or the specifications in the rice research institute in Bathalegoda Sri Lanka. In the absence of such standards, the Goods supplied shall be complied with other internationally accepted standards.

Contents of Bidding Documents

6. **Sections of Bidding Documents**
- 6.1 The Bidding Documents consist of 2 Volumes, which include all the sections indicated below, and should be read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITB Clause 8 along with the Invitation for bids in page 02 of this document.

- Section I. Instructions to Bidders (ITB)
- Section VI. Conditions of Contract (CC)
- Section VIII. Contract forms

Volume 2

- Section II. Bidding Data Sheet
- Section III. Evaluation and Qualification Criteria
- Section IV. Bidding Forms
- Section V. Schedule of Requirements
- Section VII. Contract Data

6.2 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bidding Documents Failure to furnish all information or documentation required by the Bidding Documents may result in the rejection of the bid.

7. **Clarification of Bidding Documents** 7.1 A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Tender Document including the restrictiveness of specifications shall Contact the Purchaser in writing at the Purchaser’s address specified in the Bidding document. The Purchaser will respond in writing to any request for clarification, provided that such request is received prior to the deadline for submission of Tender. The Purchaser shall forward copies of its response to all those who have purchased the Bidding document, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. Bid Documents as a result of a clarification, should the purchaser deemed it necessary to amend it shall do so following the procedure under ITB Clause 8.

8. **Amendment of Bidding Documents** 8.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Bid, the Purchaser may amend the Bidding Documents by issuing an addendum.

Any addendum issued shall be part of the Bidding Documents and shall be communicated in writing to all who have purchased the Bidding Documents.

To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum into account in preparing their bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of bids, pursuant to ITB Sub-Clauses 23.2.

Preparation of Bids

9. **Cost of Bidding** 9.1 The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid, and the Purchaser shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

10. **Language of Bid** 10.1 The Bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid (including supporting documents and printed literature) exchanged by the Bidder and the Purchaser, shall be written in English language.

11. **Documents Comprising the Bid** 11.1 The Bid shall comprise the following.

- a) Bid Submission Form and the applicable Price Schedules, in accordance with ITB Clauses 12, 14 and 15;
- b) Bid Security, in accordance with ITB Clause 20.
- c) Documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clauses 18 AND 29, that the Goods and Related Services conform to the Bid Documents;
- d) Documentary evidence in accordance with ITB Clause 18 establishing the Bidder’s qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted; and
- e) Any other document required in the Bid.

12. **Bid Submission from And Price Schedules** 12.1 The Bidder shall submit the Bid Submission Form using the form furnished in Section IV Bid Forms. This form must be

- Completed without any alterations to its format, and no substitutes shall be accepted. All blank spaces shall be filled in with the information requested.
13. **Alternative Bids** 13.1 Alternative bids shall not be considered.
14. **Bid Prices and Discounts**
- 14.1 The Bidder shall indicate on the Price Schedule the unit prices and total Bid prices of the goods it proposes to supply in USD under the Contract.
- 14.2 Any discount offered against any single item in the price schedule shall be included in the unit price of the item. However, a Bidder wishes to offer a discount as a bidder may do so by indicating such amounts appropriately.
- 14.3 If so indicated in ITB Sub-Clause 1.1, bids are being invited for individual contracts (lots) or for any combination of contracts (packages). Unless otherwise indicated in the Bid, prices quoted shall correspond to 100% of the items specified for each lot and to 100% of the quantities specified for each item of a lot. Bidders wishing to offer any price reduction (discount) for the award of more than one Contract shall specify the applicable price reduction separately.
- 14.4 (i) Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall include all duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable by the Supplier;
- a. On components and raw material used in the manufacture or assembly of goods quoted; or
- b. On the previously imported goods of foreign origin.
- (ii) However, VAT shall not be included in the price but shall be indicated separately.
- (iii) The price for inland transportation, insurance and other related services to deliver the goods to their final destination;
- (iv) The price of other incidental services.
- 14.5 The Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the Contract and not subject to variation on any account. A bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and rejected, pursuant to ITB Clause 31.
- 14.6 All lots, if any and item must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules. If a Price Schedule shows item listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other items.
15. **Currencies of Bid** 15.1 Unless otherwise stated in Bidding documents, the Bidder shall quoted in Sri Lanka Rupees and payment shall be payable only in Sri Lanka Rupees.
16. **Documents Establishing the Eligibility of the Bidder** 16.1 To establish their eligibility in accordance with ITB Clause 4, Bidders shall complete the Bid Submission Form, included in Section IV, Bidding Forms.

17. **Documents Establishing of the and Related Services**
- 17.1 To establish the conformity of the Goods and Conformity Related Services to the Bid Documents, the Bidder Goods shall furnish as part of its bid the documentary evidence that the goods conform to the technical specifications and standards specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements.
- 17.2 The documentary evidence may be in the form of literature, drawings or data and shall consist of a detailed item by item description (given in Section V, 2 Technical Specifications) of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the Goods and Related Services, Related Services to the technical specifications; and if applicable, a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Schedule of Requirements
- 17.3 The Bidder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars, including quantities, available sources and current prices of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the Goods during the period if specified in the BDS following commencement of the use of the goods by the Purchase.
18. **Documents Establishing The Qualifications of The Bidder**
- 18.1 The documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted shall establish to the Purchaser's satisfaction:
- a) A Bidder that does not manufacture or produce the Goods it offers to supply shall submit the Manufacturer's authorization using the form included in Section VIII, Bidding Forms to demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer or producer of the Goods to supply these Goods;
- b) That, if required in the BDS, in case of a Bidder not doing business within Sri Lanka, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an agent in Sri Lanka equipped and able to carry out the Supplier's maintenance, repair and spare parts stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and
- c) That the Bidder meets each of the qualification criteria specified in Section III, Evaluation and Qualification Criteria.
19. **Period of Validity of Bids**
- 19.1 Bids shall remain valid until the date specified in the BDS. A bid valid for a shorter date shall be rejected by the Purchaser as none Responsive.
- 19.2 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the bid validity date, the Purchaser may request bidders to extend the period of validity of their bids. The request and the responses shall be made in writing. If a Bid Security is requested in accordance with ITB Clause 20, it shall also be extended for a corresponding period. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder granting the request shall not be required or permitted to modify its bid.
20. **Bid Security**
- 20.1 The Bidder shall furnish as part of its bid, a Bid Security, as specified in the Bid.
- 20.2 The Bid Security shall be in the amount specified in the Bid and denominated in Sri Lanka Rupees, unless otherwise stated and shall:

- a) At the bidder's option, be in the form of either a bank draft or a bank guarantee from a banking institution;
- b) Be issued by an institution acceptable to the Purchaser.
- c) Be substantially responsive in accordance with the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms;
- d) Be payable promptly upon written demand by the Purchaser in case the conditions listed in ITB Clause 20.5 are invoked;
- e) Be submitted in its original form; copies will not be accepted;
- f) Remain valid for the period specified in the BDS.

Any bid not accompanied by a substantially responsive Bid Security in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 20.1 and 20.2, may be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive.

The Bid Security of unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned as promptly as possible upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of the Performance Security pursuant to ITB Clause 43.

The Bid Security may be forfeited executed:

- a) If a Bidder withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form, except as provided in ITB Sub-Clause 19.2; or
- b) If a Bidder does not agreeing to correction of arithmetical errors in pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 30.3
- c) If the successful Bidder fails to:
 - i. Sign the Contract in accordance with ITB Clause 42,
 - ii. Furnish a Performance Security in accordance with ITB Clause 43.

21. **Format and Signing of Bid**

- 21.1 The Bidder shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the bid as described in ITB Clause II and clearly mark it as "ORIGINAL" In addition, the Bidder shall submit a copy of the bid and clearly mark it as "COPY". In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copy, the original shall prevail.
- 21.2 The original and the Copy of the bid shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Bidder.
- 21.3 Any interlineations, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initiated by the person signing the Bid.

Submission and Opening of Bids

22. **Submission, Sealing And Marking of Bids**
- 22.1 Bidders may always submit their bids by mail or by hand.
- a) Bidders submitting bids by mail or by hand, shall enclose the original and the copy of the Bid in separate sealed envelopes, duly marking the envelopes as “ORIGINAL” and “COPY”. These envelopes containing the original and the copy shall then be enclosed in one single envelope.
- The inner and outer envelopes shall:
- a) Bear the name and address of the Bidder;
- b) Be addressed to the Purchaser in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 23.1;
- c) Bear the specific identification of this bidding process as indicated in the Bid; and
- d) Bear a warning not to open before the time and date for bid opening, in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 261.
- If all envelopes are not sealed and marked as required, the Purchaser will assume no responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the bid.
23. **Deadline for Submission of Bids**
- 23.1 Bids must be received by the Purchaser at the address and no later than the date and time specified in Bidding Data sheet.
- 23.2 The Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the dead line for the submission of bids by amending the Bid Documents in accordance with ITB Clause 8, in which case all rights and obligations of the Purchaser and Bidders previously subject to the deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.
24. **Late Bids**
- 24.1 The Purchaser shall not consider any bid that arrives after the deadline for submission of bids in accordance with ITB Clause 23. Any bid received by the Purchaser after the deadline for submission of bids shall be declared late, rejected and returned unopened to the Bidder.
25. **Withdrawal and Modification of Bids**
- 25.1 A Bidder may withdraw or modify its Bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice in accordance with ITB Clause 22, duly signed by an authorized representative and shall include a copy of the authorization in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 21.2, (except that no copies of the withdrawal notice are required). The corresponding substitution or modification of the bid must accompany the respective written notice. All notice must be;
- a) Submitted in accordance with ITB Clauses 21 and 22 (except that Withdrawal notice do not require copies), and in addition, the respective envelopes shall be clearly marked “WITHDRAWAL,” or “MODIFICATION,” and
- b) Received by the Purchaser prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 23.
- 25.2 Bids requested to be withdrawn in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 25.1 shall be returned to the Bidders only upon notification of contract award to the successful bidder in accordance with sub clause 41.1.

- 25.3 No bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form or any extension thereof.
26. **Bid Opening**
- 26.1 The Purchaser shall conduct the bid opening in public at the address, date and time specified in the BDS.
- 26.2 First, envelopes marked “WITHDRAWAL” shall be opened and read out and the envelope with the corresponding bid may be opened at the discretion of the Purchaser. No bid withdrawal shall be permitted unless the corresponding withdrawal notice contains a valid authorization to request the withdrawal and is read out at bid opening. Envelopes marked “MODIFICATION” shall be opened and read out with the corresponding Bid. No Bid modification shall be permitted unless the corresponding modification notice contains a valid authorization to request the modification and is read out at Bid opening. Only envelopes that are opened and read out at Bid opening shall be considered further.
- 26.3 All other envelopes shall be opened one at a time, reading out; the name of the Bidder and whether there is a modification; the Bid Prices; including any discounts and alternative offers; the presence of a Bid Security if required; and any other details as the Purchaser may consider appropriate. Only discounts and alternative offers read out at Bid opening shall be considered for evaluation. No Bid shall be rejected at Bid opening except for late bids in accordance with ITB Sub –Clause 24.1.
- 26.4 The Purchaser shall prepare a record of the Bid opening that shall include, as a minimum; the name of the Bidder and whether there is a withdrawal or modification; the Bid Price, per lot if applicable, including any discounts and the presence or absence of a Bid Security. The bids that were opened shall be resealed in separate envelopes, promptly after the bid opening. The Bidders representatives who are present shall be requested to sign the attendance sheet. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Bidders who submitted bids in time.

Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

27. **Confidentiality**
- 27.1 Information relating to the examination, evaluation comparison and Post-qualification (if applicable) of bids and recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until publication of the Contract Award.
- 27.2 Any effort by a Bidder to influence the purchaser in the examination, evaluation, comparison and post-qualification of the bids or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its Bid.
- 27.3 Notwithstanding ITB Sub-Clause 27.2, if any Bidder wishes to contact the Purchaser on any matter related to the bidding process, from the time of bid opening to the time of Contract Award, it should do so in writing.
28. **Clarification of Bids**
- 28.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation, comparison and post- qualification of the bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, request any Bidder for a clarification of its Bid. Any clarification submitted by a Bidder in respect to its Bid and that is not in response to a request by the Purchaser shall not be considered for the purpose of evaluation. The Purchaser’s request for clarification and the response shall be in writing. No change in the prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered or permitted except to confirm the correction of arithmetic errors discovered by the Purchaser in the Evaluation of the bids in accordance with ITB Clause 30.

29. **Responsiveness of Bids**
- 29.1 The Purchaser's determination of a bid's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the bid itself.
- 29.2 A substantially responsive bid is one that conforms to all the terms, conditions and specifications of the Bid Documents without material deviation reservation or omission. A material deviation, reservation or omission is one that;
- a) Affects in any substantial way the scope, quality or performance of the Goods and Related Services specified in the Contract; or
 - b) Limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the Bid Documents, the Purchaser's rights or the Bidder's obligations under the Contract; or
 - c) If rectified would unfairly affect the competitive position of other bidders presenting substantially responsive bids.
- 29.3 If a bid is not substantially responsive to the Bidding Documents, it shall be rejected by the Purchaser and may not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation or omission.
30. **Nonconformities, and Omission**
- 30.1 Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may waive any errors, non-conformities or omissions in the Bid that do not constitute a material deviation.
- 30.2 Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may request that the Bidder submit the necessary information or documentation, within a reasonable period of time, to rectify nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions in the bid related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the Bid. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Bid.
- Provided that the Bid is substantially responsive the Purchaser shall correct arithmetical errors on the following basis;

04.Shipping & Quality Terms

Rice Consignment has to be approved as “Fit for human Consumption “by Industrial Technology Institute (ITI) Test Lab or RRDI Bathalagoda Test Lab. or Quality tests conducted by Sri Lanka Customs or food Administration unit Ministry of Health and random sampling has to be qualified as “Fit for human Consumption”

Return Procedure

If any shipment quality is rejected, shipper needs to replace the consignment with new one and full container (FCL) will be returned and exported to origin country and expenses of such event to be borne by the shipper including shipping charges, delivery & statutory charges in the destination country before export being started.

In case of reporting of quality rejects beyond 1% required to be replaced by the shipper. Charges for the shipment including delivery, shipping & statutory charges in the origin and destination country has to be borne by the shipper for rejected consignments as combined or individual shipments.

Shipping Demurrages

Demurrages due to non-availability of shipping documents on time for clearance or banking procedure at the destination and or due to not issue release order by the shipping agent at the destination port to be borne by the shipper.
